<u>This Week's Focus:</u> Suffering offers an opportunity for us to grow in Christ-likeness by obeying God and loving and serving others.

This Week's Text: 1 Peter: 4:1-11

God is most glorified in us when we are most satisfied in Him. John Piper

Related Texts: Psalm 73:25-26, Hebrews 5:7-8, Matthew 26:36-46, John 13:34, Proverbs 10:12

Observations and Questions for Discussion:

- What has God spoken to you about regarding the sermon?
- How has Jesus provided us an example of suffering in the flesh?
 - What does it mean to suffer in the flesh like Jesus?
 - o For what reason are we to arm ourselves?
- What does it look like to live no longer for human passions but for the will of God?
 - What things can we do to try to discern the will of God?
- What do verses 3-4 tell us about being in the culture but not of the culture?
 - Have you ever been targeted and called out for not participating in the ways of culture that are contrary to scripture?
 - o How was God able to use that situation for the furthering of the gospel and His glory?

- How do verses 6-7a comfort those who never see reward for righteousness in this life?
- Why are Christians called to be "self-controlled and sober-minded?"
 - o Is prayer something in your life that is neglected?
- What does verse 10 tell us about spiritual gifts?
 - o Why does God give us spiritual gifts?
 - o Do you know your spiritual gift? If not, have you ever sought after knowing your gift? (If you haven't taken a spiritual gift assessment, there is a link to one in the "Resources" section below.
 - Are you putting your gift to use for the kingdom of God?)
 - Why is relying on God's strength important?
- Peter ended our text with a short doxology.
 - o In what areas of our lives are we supposed to glorify God?
 - o How can we glorify God in our suffering?

Gospel Celebration:

- Jesus's death and resurrection has paid the penalty of our sin and set us free from the power of sin.
- In the Gospel God has shown His love and hospitality toward us.

Our Response:

- Give God glory in all circumstances by obeying, trusting and being satisfied in Him.
- Repent of our worldly behavior and refocus on seeking God's will.
- Pray for God to reveal your spiritual gift(s) and seek to use them for His glory!
