This Week's Focus: How the power of the gospel comes to the City of Athens.

This Week's Text: Acts 17:16-34

For though I am free from all, I have made myself a servant to all, that I might win more of them. To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though not being myself under the law) that I might win those under the law. To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (not being outside the law of God but under the law of Christ) that I might win those outside the law. To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that by all means I might save some. I do it all for the sake of the gospel, that I may share with them in its blessings. **1 Corinthians 9:19-23**

<u>Related Texts</u>: Colossians 1:15-17, 1 Corinthians 1:18-25, John 17:14-18

Observations and Questions for Discussion:

- How has God spoken to you regarding the sermon and/or text?
- What is an idol? What are some modern-day idols?
- What did Paul see and feel as he entered Athens? What does he do and what can we learn from his example?
 - Are we distressed when we see our idols and the idols of our community?
- Discuss and describe the different people groups in our text.
- So far in chapter 17, Paul has visited Thessalonica, Berea, and Athens. Each city presented Paul with a different challenge. How were Paul's presentations of the gospel different? What remained the same?

- What does it look like to be a missionary in your context?
- Discuss the two teams we want to avoid as we live on mission with Jesus: syncretism and separatism.
- How does Paul use their worship of idols to bring them to an understanding of Jesus?
- What are some ways we can connect with others yet remain set apart for God?
- What principles (truths) does Paul layout to show them who the true God is? Reference verses 24-31.
- What is the main point Paul is getting at in verse 27?
- How well did Paul know the culture? How well do you know the culture?
- Paul concludes his message by proclaiming Christ. Reference verses 30-32.
 - Why is that important and significant?
 - Why is the resurrection mentioned?
- How difficult is it to turn conversations around to the gospel?
- How would you explain this truth to someone who does not know Jesus?
- Discuss the three responses to Paul's sermon. References verses 32-34.

Gospel Celebration:

- The gospel is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes.
- Jesus looked down from heaven and saw our idolatry, and did not run from it, did not emulate it, but engaged this broken world to save us from our sin.

Prayer:

- Pray for opportunity and wisdom to share Christ.
- Pray for wisdom as we live on mission and engage cultural and racial differences for the cause of Christ.
