This Week's Focus: Worship: first things first.

This Week's Text: Ezra 3

"Truth without emotion produces dead orthodoxy and a church full or half full of artificial admirers (like people who write generic anniversary cards for a living). On the other hand, emotion without truth produces empty frenzy and cultivates shallow people who refuse the discipline of rigorous thought. But true worship comes from people who are deeply emotional and who love deep and sound doctrine. Strong affections for God rooted in truth are the bone and marrow of biblical worship." **John Piper**

- Read verses 1-3. What did they build and why?
 - o What does this say about their priority?
- What sacrifices did they offer and why? Reference Leviticus 17:11.
- What did Jerusalem represent to a returning Israelite?
- What feast did they keep? Reference verse 4. Describe and explain its purpose.
- The Jews took very careful steps in how they worshiped. Why? What does that say about God? What does the say about man?

- How important is unity among God's people?
- Discuss the five characteristics mentioned concerning worship at King's Chapel: God-centered,
 Content-driven, Highly-participatory, Authentically-experienced, Peripherally-evangelistic.
- Describe in your own words the scene in verses 8-13.
- What is the result of and the people's response to this great event?
 - o What stands out to you the most?
 - o Why were the shouts of joy mingled with deep felt grief?
- Have you ever experienced sorrow during a worship gathering?
- In what ways does the gospel speak to the brokenness all around us?
