This Week's Focus: Being a disciple of Jesus Christ.

<u>This Week's Text</u>: Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 2:36-46,11:19-26

## **Observations and Questions for Discussion:**

- What has God spoken to you about regarding the text/sermon?
- Discuss the meaning of being a disciple. When does it begin? What are some of the traits?
- Share how and when Jesus called you to himself.
- In Matthew 28:18-20 Jesus gives the church (his disciples) their marching orders. What are they? How well are you (we) doing?
- What are some of the challenges you have following Jesus and his will according to Matthew 28:18-20?
- Discuss the three benefits of evangelism.
  - o Evangelism helps keep the gospel central in our lives and therefore in our churches.
  - o Evangelism deepens our understanding of the fundamental truths of Scripture.
  - o Properly motivated evangelism grows our love for God and neighbor.

- Read Genesis 1:26 and 2:18-20 and discuss:
  - o God's communal Trinitarian nature.
  - o Our need for community even within perfect humanity. (Adam's need for community was before sin entered the world.)
- What is the "ground war and air war" approach to community?
- Discuss the many benefits of gathering in community.
- Read Acts 11:19-26 and discuss the different roles of Barnabas and Saul/Paul in the discipleship
  of the Church.
- Discuss the many ways discipleship happens. What do they all have in common?
- What is a missionary? Reference John 17:18, 20:21; Acts 1:8; 2 Corinthians 5:17-20.
- Pastor Lou mentioned 3 ways to live as missionaries.
  - o Be biblical. What is a biblical worldview? Why is it important to know and understand people's worldviews?
  - o Be practical. What are some practical ways you can press people about their idols and their false beliefs? What are practical ways to turn conversions to Christ?
  - o Be Intentional. What are some ways you can intentionally live on mission?
