THIS WEEK'S FOCUS

YHWH is the unrivaled God who graciously saves sinners from the burden of idolatry and will judge those who persist in their defiance against His rightful authority.

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION (Use along with Reading: Ante Faciem Dei)

- What truth is Isaiah communicating with the metaphor at the opening of chapter 46? What theme do 46:1-2 and 47:1-3 share?
- Explain how idols burden us. How do we avoid wasting our God-given talents and skills?
- When we find it difficult to trust God, what is the remedy (46:8-10)?
- Who is the "bird of prey" that God will use to accomplish his purpose (46:11)?
- How will God judge Babylon for her sin? What was the nation's chief sin (47:8, 10)?
- Explain how God had used Babylon for his greater purpose (verse 6). Why were they still culpable for their actions?
- What does each of the titles in 47:4 reveal about God and his dealing with Babylon?
- On what did Babylon depend for her safety, security, and prosperity? When experiencing trials and difficulties, where do you tend to turn for your safety, security, and comfort?
- What does Babylon symbolize in Scripture (Revelation 18)?
- How does this text anticipate Jesus Christ and his gospel?
